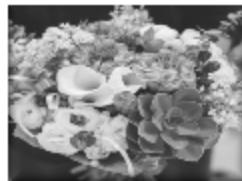

WHAT DOES PEACE LOOK LIKE?

- ◆ Stillness? Serenity? Tranquility? Harmony?
- ◆ Is it Active or Passive?
- ◆ Is it within us? Our families? Our neighborhoods? Our schools?

In *"Practicing Peace in Times of War,"* Pema Chödrön writes "War and Peace begin in the hearts of individuals."

Richard Rohr writes "Today many think we can achieve peace through violence. The myth that violence solves problems is part of the way we think and is in direct opposition to all great religious teachings. Our need for immediate control leads us to disconnect consistency, connection and unit between means and ends. We even names a missile created for the destruction of humanity a "peacekeeper." But, such a peace is a false peace, (the *Pax Romana* of mutually assured destruction (MAD.) We must work for the *Pax Christi* of mutually-assured forgiveness.

What does the Peace of Jesus look like?

We know when tested by the political elite, the Pharisees, Sadducees and Scribes, Jesus always had a loving response. He was centered on Love. He emphatically tells us the first two commandments are the foundation of our humanity. Love God above all and our neighbor as ourselves. He didn't bring up the "Shall Nots" list. He wants our hearts. God loved us into existence. In 4:19 We love *because* He loved us first. We are called to be conduits of that love. How? By loving others as brothers. Jesus tells us Mt 5:23-24 "If therefore you are offering your gift at the altar and remember your brother has anything against you, be reconciled with him then come offer your gift. In Luke 6:41 Jesus asks "Why do you look at speck in your brother's eye but fail to see the beam in your own?" Jesus offered us reassurance that the Spirit will be our guide for Peace. In Jn 14:27, Jesus spoke, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives to you." Peace of Jesus needs boots on the ground. It needs messengers of love, advocates for justice, activists, educators and prayer warriors. It needs YOU. How can YOU get into some "Good Trouble" as John Lewis recommends? Volunteer. Start small - Mother Theresa writes "Don't worry about the numbers, just start with those closest to you." As Mother Angelica reminds us: "God from all eternity chose you to be where you are at this time in history to change our world." Gandhi challenges us to be the change we want to see.



Being Human is to Doubt

Humans doubt. It's what we do. We doubt ourselves and we doubt others.

Before any of us say anything about Peter's doubting the words of Jesus that told him he could get out of his boat and walk on water, we need to get real with ourselves: How would I respond in the same situation? I remember when I was child taking swimming lessons. One day I simply tightened up my muscles and sank. The lifeguard pulled me up and asked what happened. I said I did not know. The truth is that I was sinking under the weight of my own doubt. I did not believe I could do what clearly, I was told I could. That was only in five feet of water in a pool! Now that I'm older, I can look back and laugh. But an adult, the swimming pool is life, and I would be lying if I said that there are no longer times I find myself sinking due to new doubts.

Much of our doubt comes about because of a lack of trust in God. We place our trust in material things, wealth, or imperfect people instead of the One who is worthy of our trust 100 percent of the time. Our stewardship is often hampered by our doubt that God will provide all that we need. If I give more, I may not have enough to survive! When we place all our trust in God, not only do we find that we have been given all we need – our doubt that cause us to sink in the pool of life fades away. We don't suddenly become perfect in our trust, and there will be times when we find ourselves with concerns again. However, it is in those moments we find that He is still there, speaking the words we need to hear: "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid."

Everyday Stewardship

I remember when all three of my children were learning to swim. In the beginning, it seemed like no matter how much assurance I gave them, they were certain they would drown. Even after watching me float in the water, they were pretty sure their bodies were created to sink. In time, they grew more comfortable in the water. Eventually, they could even swim the length of the pool. But this did not happen overnight. They had to grow in their faith that swimming was possible, not just for others, but for them as well.

Too many of us who are Christians believe that holiness is for someone else. We believe that the stories of the saints are about super humans who had something in greater supply than us. When our faith is weak, we assume that we can never have the faith of these holy men and women.

On the contrary, faith and holiness are not things only possible for a few. But we must practice our faith to grow in our faith. We must strive for holiness if we are to become holy.

Like a child fears the water before learning to swim, we often fear the path that leads to greater faith or holiness. We are not convinced that God can work in our lives to create a saint. Yet except for Mary, the Immaculate Conception, every saint was a sinner. God called every saint to exit the boat and walk toward Jesus on the water. In time, with practice and trust in God, they found they did not sink either.
