



I would like, first of all, to thank you for all you do to maintain our Church and to keep it going. Even in the face of the very challenging time of Covid-19, you have continued being faithful stewards, and I thank you very much.

I come to you this time humbly asking for your financial assistance to replace our HVAC in the main church, which is now less functional, and expensive on our electric bill. You may have noted that lately, whenever we turn it on during the recent cold days, it brings out cold air, to the discomfort of many of us! We have been advised to replace it.

We are looking at \$44,278 to get a new one. Thanks to your continued generosity, we have \$ 20,134 in our cash reserve account that I intend to use to start this project. I would not want though, to have that account completely depleted. It is the reason I am appealing to you for anything you can to make our church once again conducive for worship.

I thank you for your consideration in this matter, as you have always done.

#### **EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS**

#### The Audacity of Holiness

Do you know a holy person? I'm not talking about piety — that's important, too, in its own way. But right now, I'm speaking of holiness.

St. Therese of Lisieux called holiness "a disposition of the heart that makes us humble and little in the arms of God, aware of our weakness, and confident — in the most audacious way — in His Fatherly goodness."

The holy person sees a storm on the horizon of life, and rather than give themselves over to fear and despair (natural and understandable reactions), regards the gathering winds as an opportunity to rely more fully on God. The holy person takes a bad situation and sanctifies it with charity and understanding that defies our fallen human nature.

Peter's mother-in-law was still in the throes of a fever when Jesus grasped her hand. It wasn't until she took his hand and allowed him to help her up that "the fever left her and she waited on them." Before the fever could leave her, she had to commit to holiness — to put her trust in him in a most audacious way. She had to find it within herself to lift her weakened hand to grasp his — and as soon as she did, she was rewarded. Her bodily health restored, she gave thanks, and attended to his needs.

God's hand is always outstretched to us. Will we take it, even if the fever of sin and pride and worldly concerns rages in our souls? Will we muster the strength? Will we be audacious enough to have confidence in His Fatherly goodness?



#### YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

With the Apostolic Letter "Patris corde" ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" from 8 December 2020, to 8 December 2021.

In this document the Pope identifies St. Joseph in seven different conditions attributes. (Quotes are Pope Francis' words.)

- 1. A beloved father "Saint Pope Paul VI pointed out that Joseph concretely expressed his fatherhood 'by making his life a sacrificial service to the mystery of the incarnation and its redemptive purpose." How in our lives do we show sacrificial service to God?
- 2. A tender and loving father "As the Lord had done with Israel, so Joseph did with Jesus: he taught him to walk, taking him by the hand; he was for him like a father who raises an infant to his cheeks, bending down to him and feeding him (cf. Hos 11:3-4)." How do we quide others on their journey of faith?
- 3. An obedient father "As he had done with Mary, God revealed his saving plan to Joseph. God did so by using dreams and were considered a way for him to make his will be known. Obedience made it possible for Joseph to surmount his difficulties and spare Mary." How are we obedient to the silent word of God to surmount our difficulties?
- 4. An accepting father "Joseph accepted Mary unconditionally. He trusted in the angel's words. Even though he does not understand the bigger picture, he makes a decision to protect Mary's good name, her dignity and her life." Have we made decisions that protect the dignity of life?
- 5. A creative courageous father "God acted by trusting in Joseph's creative courage. Joseph took a stable and, as best he could, turned it into a welcoming home for the Son of God. (cf. *Lk* 2:6-7). Faced with danger, Joseph was warned once again and rose in the middle of the night to prepare the flight into Egypt (cf. *Mt* 2:13-14)". *How have we found ways to be creatively courageous in responding to God's plan?*
- 6. A working father "Joseph was a carpenter who earned an honest living to provide for his family. From him, Jesus learned the value, the dignity and the joy of what it means to eat bread that is the fruit of one's own labor." Does our work exhibit value, dignity, and joy?
- 7. A father in the shadows "Joseph found happiness not in mere self-sacrifice but in self-gift. In him, we never see frustration but only trust. His patient silence was the prelude to concrete expressions of trust." Do we pattern our lives after Joseph with trust and in silent sacrifice?

So, as we celebrate this "Year of St. Joseph" in our parishes, may we always remember St. Joseph's position in the life of Jesus and his contribution to our salvation. And how can we change our lives in the pattern of Joseph? Throughout this year, we will be saying the following prayer in honor of St. Joseph before all Masses asking for his intercessions in our lives. But also pray it daily for St. Joseph to help to intercede in guiding your life.

Oh, Saint Joseph, foster-father of Jesus, most pure spouse of the Virgin Mary, pray for us daily to the same Jesus, the Son of God, that we, being defended by the power of His grace and striving faithfully in life, may be crowned by Him at the hour of death. Amen.




