

ENCOUNTER

FOR A SYNODAL CHURCH: COMMUNION, PARTICIPATION AND MISSION

You've probably heard these words already: "Synod on Synodality". If you have not yet heard about them, here they are now. Pope Francis has called the universal church into a moment of prayer, listening and walking together as a Church, starting October 2021 to 2023 with the World Synod of Bishops in the Vatican. Pope Francis envisions a Synodal Church through Communion, Participation and Mission.

In the October 18, 2021 edition of the Catholic Virginian, Bishop Knestout introduced the Synod to the people of the Diocese. He explains: "'Synod' is a Greek word that literally means 'on the same path', so the Holy Father has asked the whole Church to 'journey together' on the same path in communion with one another. In communion, we join with one another to listen to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit and prayerfully discern God's will for us. Our mission, as a faith community, is to act upon what we've heard.

Every Diocese has been asked to participate in this unique process with a particular focus at the local level, specifically parishes and local communities. Within the Diocese of Richmond, Bishop Knestout is asking parishes to begin a consultative process with their advisory bodies (ex. Parish Councils and Finance Councils) and the diverse people of the parish communities. In a particular way these moments of dialogue should not just be with the same people whose voices are always heard, but rather an opportunity to provide newcomers and the marginalized a chance to be heard.

I have asked <u>Melissa Kenney</u> and <u>John Murphy</u> to help me at St. Joseph Church to plan any meetings and dialogues for the purposes of Synod on Synodality, and they have both generously accepted to help me lead this process.

At Sts. Peter and Paul, I have requested <u>Frank Pilk</u> and <u>Carol Powers</u> to lead in this very important exercise and process. And they have also accepted this burden of leading our parishioners.

In the next few weeks, these lead persons will give us word about this process. I request that when you're called upon, please come forward to attend these important meetings. Let us not leave anyone behind, for we are journeying together on the same important path leading to Our Father in heaven.



ST. STEPHEN | FEAST DAY DECEMBER 26

The Acts of the Apostles tells the story of St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr. A man filled with grace and power, he worked great wonders among the people. Some Jews debated with St. Stephen but could not match his wisdom and spirit. Eventually, a charge of blasphemy was brought up against him, and the local population demanded that he be tried and sentenced. He was seized and carried before the Sanhedrin.

Despite the danger he faced, in front of the Sanhedrin and his accusers, St. Stephen gave a long speech about the history of Israel and the blessings that God had given upon His chosen people. He talked about how Israel had become disobedient despite God's abundant mercy. This enraged his accusers, and eventually the crowd dragged him out of the city and stoned him to death.

Even in his final moments, St. Stephen displayed great forgiveness and even asked God not to hold the sins of his attackers against them. Hundreds of years after his death, he is still a role model for us to follow.

amilies can be very difficult things to negotiate. This is true not only of our families of origin, the current family of which we are a part, the family of our Church, our society, and our global family as well. Everything human can be found in family stories. Those stories speak of

wonderful life-giving successes as well as painful spirit-robbing abuses. Our greatest joys and our greatest wounds are usually connected with the experience of family. Our needs, experiences, and unresolved baggage often color what we bring to our familiar relationships. They contribute to our level of defensiveness, how guarded and protected we become, and what prejudices we believe.

In order to break the cycle of dysfunction we have to remember that it is not only by human effort that we negotiate the difficult and challenging events of our lives. There is a Divine Effort at work as well. For sure, the human effort can create quite a mess and easily destroy lives. This is true of any family with which we are associated. Today's Feast of the Holy Family serves to help us understand that there is a Divine Story being told as well. It is a story of perseverance in the face of hardship, determination in the face of despair, healing when we see nothing but wounds, and light where there is darkness.

Do we believe that God is always working, guiding, restoring, and leading? Unless we do, we will never be free from the imperfections and wounds that bind us and never be able to understand what it really means to forgive. Pope Francis tells us that the "light which comes from the Holy Family encourages us to offer human warmth to other families." While this is most certainly true, we can only really begin to do this when we realize that we are still works in progress, not anchored to the wounds and sins of our past, and still a leading star in God's continually

unfolding story of love. The Holy Family persevered and radiated warmth because they knew they were not alone. We can too.



COMING BACK TO CHURCH

QUESTION:



EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

All in the Family

A t first glance, we can often find the image of the Blessed Mother, St. Joseph and the Christ Child intimidating who are we to aspire to that level of discipleship? How could we ever hope to conform ourselves to that mold? Sometimes, it can even be painful — perhaps we hail from a broken family or struggle with a broken relationship within our family, or perhaps we long to be a mother or a father ourselves and that state in life has eluded us.

But the image of the Holy Family is, in reality, a beautiful invitation to us all, no matter our vocation or our state in life, and the example of Mary, Joseph and Jesus is rich with the symbolism of stewardship.

You need not be a biological mother who has carried a child in her womb to be a mother in spirit. Who in your world needs you to love them with the heart of a mother?

The same goes for fatherhood. The Church and the world are crying out for the courageous witness of Christian men like St. Joseph. Who can you love with the steadfast, selfless protection of a father?

Who in your life needs you to love them with the faithful, unconditional love of a son? Who needs your gentle and constant love as a daughter?

We are the Body of Christ, friends. Those of us rejoicing in heaven, those of us suffering in purgatory, and those of us struggling here on earth. We are the great family. Let us love each other well.
