



ENCOUNTER

THE MYSTERY OF THE EUCHARIST – PART 1

Over the next several weeks, there will be excepts from a USCCB document on the Eucharist. This is the first excerpt – the **INTRODUCTION**.

"On March 27, 2020, at an early point in the global pandemic, Pope Francis walked alone in the rain across an empty St. Peter's Square to offer prayer for the world in a time of crisis. "Faith", he said, "begins when we realize we are in need of salvation. We are not self-sufficient; by ourselves we founder we need the Lord, like ancient navigators needed the stars." (Pope Francis *Extraordinary Moment of Prayer*) Recalling when Jesus was asleep in the boat as a tempest was raging (Mk 4:35-41), the Holy Father said, "The Lord awakens so as to reawaken and revive our Easter faith." (Pope John Paul II, *Dies Domini*, 31). In similar fashion, Pope Saint John Paul II reminded us of this ongoing presence when he repeated to us the words of Christ: *I am with you always, to the end of the age* (Mt 28:20).

We call on these inspiring words of the saintly Pope John Paul II as we offer these reflections on the importance of the Eucharist in the life of the Church. We do so mindful of how the pandemic has forced us to stay physically distant from one another and, for a time, to view the celebration of the Mass on a television or computer screen. Many of the faithful appear to have had their faith and their desire for the Eucharist strengthened by such a long separation.

As Christians we know that we need Christ to be present in our lives. He is our very sustenance as he reminded us: *unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you* (Jn 6:53). Yet, we also know that he is present to us in a way that binds us together as one body, which we proclaim by our "Amen" in responding to the invitation: The Body of Christ. Again, we call on the words of the beloved Polish pope: "For this presence to be properly proclaimed and lived, it is not enough that the disciples of Christ pray individually and commemorate the death and Resurrection of Christ inwardly, in the secrecy of their hearts. Those who have received the grace of baptism are not saved as individuals alone, but as members of the Mystical Body, having become part of the People of God.". (Pope John Paul II, *Dies Domini*, 31)

As we continue to welcome people back to the communal celebration of the Mass, it must be acknowledged that no document can exhaust the mystery of the gift of the Eucharist. Nevertheless, at various times, it is desirable to reflect on certain facets of the mystery that are relevant to contemporary issues and challenges and that help us to appreciate more deeply the gift of grace that has been given to us."

"Lord of the Eucharist, pray for us."

2022 ANNUAL DIOCESAN APPEAL

Have you ever done a "trust fall"? It's a pretty crazy concept. With your eyes closed and arms folded over your chest, you fall straight backwards. Of course, there's a very important element that hasn't yet been mentioned: someone is standing behind you, ready to catch you.

The "trust fall" illustrates such an important truth: we are only willing to take a risk, to "fall," when someone we trust is with us.

In our Gospel today, Peter commits to his own "trust fall," casting in his nets after a whole night of fruitless fishing, all because he trusts the Lord and the Lord instructs him to. As a parish, we're doing a "trust fall" right now, as we strive to respond to our Annual Diocesan Appeal. It can feel like a big risk to ask to be vulnerable and ask our community members to help meet our diocesan needs, but we do it because we trust—both in the Lord, but also in all the people who make up this parish community—including you.

Maybe contributing to the Annual Diocesan Appeal feels like a risk for you. Which is fine! The key, however, is to never forget that we're not doing this alone. We're taking part in the Annual Diocesan Appeal as part of a diocesan community we trust, and with the love and support of a Lord who never leaves us. When we change our perspective from "fear" to "trust," how does our willingness to give change? Take some time today to ground yourself in trust of the Lord, and see how your heart responds. Jesus asks big things of us—because He knows that He'll always be there for us. Our diocese needs your help in supporting our Annual Diocesan Appeal. How does your trust in the Lord change your openness to giving?


SOME FORETHOUGHT & CONSIDERATION, PLEASE!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Pope Francis has called the Universal Church to a Synod that is focused on prayer, listening, and walking together as a Church. This started in October and will last through 2023 ending with the World Synod of Bishops in the Vatican. The Holy Father calls for a Synodal Church through Communion, Participation, and Mission. The Church has launched into the Synod on Synodality.

In October, Bishop Knestout introduced the Synod to all the people in our Diocese. He explained: "Synod is a Greek word that literally means 'on the same path', so the Holy Father asked the whole Church to 'journey together' on the same path in communion with one another.

Have you heard these words and want to know more? We are looking for your thoughts and prayers as we answer the call to Synodality together as a parish family. We are interested in your thoughts so please follow the link and read all about it and jot down your questions.



When we encounter or even ponder God's magnificence, power and awesomeness, we easily begin to feel our own smallness and perceived insignificance. After all, who can compete with eternal greatness, seraphim, or the ability to catch great numbers of fish?

We unfortunately think that God's presence somehow overrides us, reduces our importance, and only seeks to judge our inadequacies and doubts. Things begin to change a bit when we realize that what we may have seen as overwhelming and frightening is really only unconditional, unmerited love. Love has tremendous majesty and power. When we listen to this power and stop seeing it as a threat or dooming, our fear dissipates and Divine friendship takes root.

Remaining close to what we once preferred at a distance, we can journey to places we never thought possible and do things we never thought we could do. Strengthened by Divine friendship and encouraged by its life-giving power, we can say "here I am, send me!" when God asks, "whom shall I send?" Sin and fear no longer are of concern to the one who remains close to God in a bond of trust.



SAINT OF THE WEEK –

St. Josephine Bakhita | February 8

The story of St. Josephine Bakhita (1869-1947) is a story that many people taken into slavery have experienced. Born in the Darfur region of Sudan, she was kidnapped at the age of 8 and sold into slavery many times. As she passed from owner to owner, she experienced the moral and physical humiliations associated with slavery. It was only at the age of 13 that her suffering was alleviated after she was bought for the Italian Consul in Sudan. It was here that she was fortunate to receive kindness, respect, and peace from her new master.

She was later handed over to the Canossian Sisters when she made the case that slavery had been outlawed in Italy for years. She was baptized and confirmed in the Catholic Church in 1890, where she took the name Josephine. She later entered the Institute of St. Magdalene of Canossa in 1893 and made her profession three years later.

St. Josephine Bakhita's next 50 years were spent serving people through cooking, sewing, embroidery, and housekeeping. She was a source of encouragement and her constant smile won people's hearts, as did her humility and simplicity. Today she is known as the patron saint of victims of modern slavery and human trafficking. ©LPi
