



ENCOUNTER

LENTEN FAST: GRACE FILLED, BENEFITING THOSE IN NEED AND OUR PARISH!

At the start of Lent, as we are marked with ashes on our foreheads, we are reminded that we are dust, and that we shall return to dust. The other formula calls us to repent and believe the gospel. While keeping all that at the back of our mind, the Church calls its members to three works and duties for Lent, namely: Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. These three attest to our belief that we are dust and returning to dust, while repenting and believing the gospel of Christ.

A Christian is aware that s/he is dust and returns to dust, has hope in the Lord who turns dust, and brings life out of it. Our life hidden and buried with Christ, must necessarily find its meaning in Christ's resurrection. Indeed Lent eventually leads us to the Joy of the Resurrection at Easter.

Prayer connects a Christian to his God and creator who is the very reason for his being. But as we pray, we are made aware that man does not live on bread alone (cf. Mt. 4:4), and so prayer leads to fasting – that surrendering to the word that comes from the mouth of God. As we fast, we are acknowledging that the earthly, material world is good, but it's not the end. This prompts us to share our earthly goods with those in need as we give Alms. Earthly goods are better enjoyed when they are shared with fellow pilgrims on this journey leading home, especially those in need or less privileged than us.

This Lent, what are you considering giving up? Probably you will give up a cup of coffee in the morning to benefit another person. You may consider giving up a glass of wine for forty days of Lent. Whatever you consider giving up in fasting for Lent, can you please consider sharing it with someone especially those less privileged than you?

On a more personal level, I would like to make a very humble appeal to you, dear parishioners of Sts. Peter and Paul. As you put aside what you could have spent on a cup of coffee for example, can you consider sharing it with our Parish in our effort to pay off our debt by 2026?

I am humbly appealing to you if you can, to put aside some change towards our debt. In a parish of about 600 parishioners, if each were to give up a cup of coffee of \$2 for forty days, that would be \$80 @ parishioner, we would be able to raise \$ 48,000 during Lent. Wouldn't that be great! What a great way to spend our Lenten fast as we benefit our parish!

Please consider taking one of those tins, and save something to benefit our parish. I thank you heartily!

I wish you a grace filled and fruitful Lent 2022!


The Catholic Diocese of Richmond is seeking a Director for the Office of Christian Formation.





We have therefore set aside Thursday, March 31st at 6:30pm as a day for us as St. Joseph parishioners for a Penitential Service and individual confessions. We are inviting other priests to come over to help us fulfil our Lenten duty.

Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving as mentioned already also makes the season of Lent special in character. Christians step up in a special way to benefit those who are at a disadvantaged position than themselves. Parishes can also benefit from the generosity of their parishioners from what they are fasting from. Indeed, Lent makes us appreciate the earthly goods more, yet with a stronger faith that God is our Ultimate and Lasting Good.

At our most recent Pastoral Council held on February the 17th, we noted a number of projects that need attention in order to benefit our parish. Among others: 1. Paint bead board and trim 2. Replace carpet 3. Install snow guards on church roof over sidewalk and ramp 4. Repair and paint exterior windows 5. Paint ceiling and walls 6. Repair and paint altar walls 7. Keyboard for our choir 8. Improve on the sound system.

We, therefore, proposed that we encourage our parishioners that as each gives up something for Lent, we consider the good of our church – St. Joseph. It is my humble request, therefore, to anyone who can, that as you Pray, Fast and Give Alms during this Lent, to consider our Church that is in need this time.

SAINT OF THE WEEK St. Katharine Drexel | March 3

With a family like hers, it's no wonder that St. Katharine Drexel (November 26, 1858 - March 3, 1955) grew up to become one of the first American-born saints.

Born in Philadelphia in 1858, her mother passed away when she was only five weeks old. Her father, a renowned banker, remarried a wonderful woman, and together they raised St. Katherine Drexel and her two sisters in a life of privilege. Both financially and spiritually well-endowed, the Drexels were devout Catholics and set an excellent example of true Christian servitude with prayer and care for the poor.

After her father's death, St. Katharine Drexel gave up her inheritance and instead devoted her life to the material and spiritual well-being of black and native Americans. Mother Drexel, as she would become known, established the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Indians and Colored, and together they opened a boarding school in Santa Fe, the first of 50 missions for Native Americans in 16 states.

At 77, she suffered a heart attack and was forced to retire from active ministry. She spent the next 20 years of her life in quiet yet intense prayer. She died at the age of 96 and was can onized in 2000 by Pope John Paul II.
