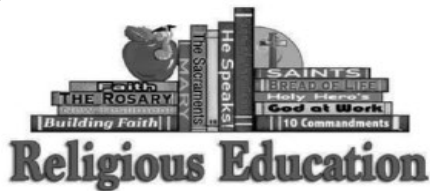


The state of our parish through three quarters of the 2022 fiscal year is good. Donations and income were down slightly; however, savings in parish operations and faith formation and evangelization offset the shortfall in income. Year-to-date envelope donations were slightly less than budgeted (-\$13,000). Income from ministries and charity were slightly more than budgeted (+\$5,400). Debt reduction contributions were exactly on budget.

Year-to-date expenses were slightly less than budgeted. This is due mainly to savings in parish operations and faith formation and evangelization (-\$22,000). This savings more than offset over-budget ministry spending (+\$5,000) and facilities spending (+\$8,000). The budget for ministries and facilities was set in the middle of the pandemic and did not anticipate spending at a normal level. Budgets are being prepared for fiscal year ending 2023 now. Each ministry was asked to estimate their spending for the coming year to more accurately budget for spending.

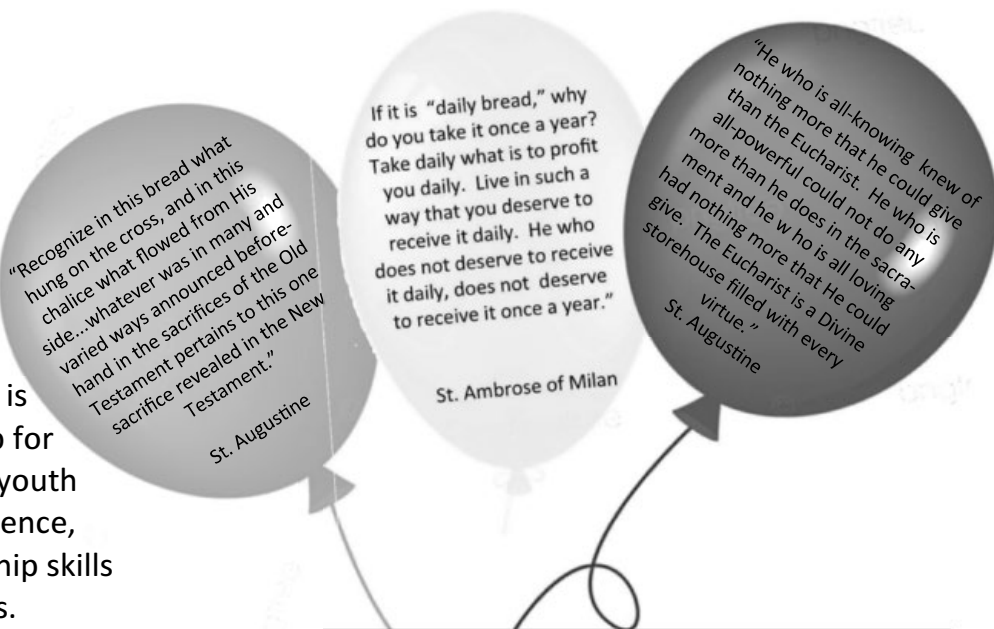

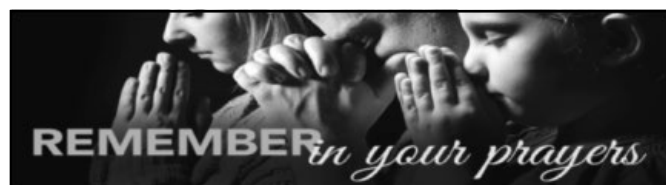

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

Make a Way

What’s your comfort zone: emotionally, professionally, personally? We all have one. But did you realize that you can have one spiritually? Think about what you like and what you don’t particularly enjoy when it comes to church, prayer, and liturgy. We all have “those songs” we crinkle our noses at, either because they’re too modern or too old-fashioned. We all have “those people” in our parish whose ideas we aren’t so sure about, whether that’s because they’re trying to change too much or because they seem always to be looking toward the past. Also, when was the last time you sat on the OTHER side of the church during Mass?

As much as we may not want to admit it, even (and especially) as people of God, we get deeply attached to our own personal comfort zones — and we tend to view those outside with distrust. But what if God had a comfort zone? What if He viewed us, in our sin and our misery, as too “far away” from Himself to reach? Thankfully, our God is a God who “opens a way in the sea and a path in the mighty waters.” Our God is a God who does “something new.”

The call to stewardship demands that we look outside of ourselves. Our thoughts, our opinions, our preferences — these things are not important to the steward. Even if there is a vast, dry desert of discord, or a seemingly endless wasteland of opposing views between us and our neighbor, God challenges us to “make a way” out of our comfort zone, that together we may announce His praise.

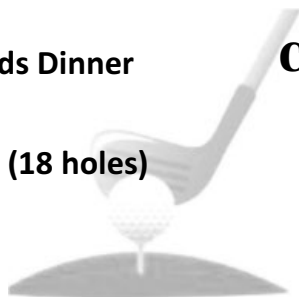

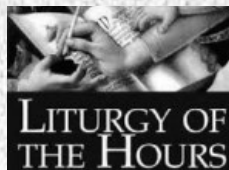

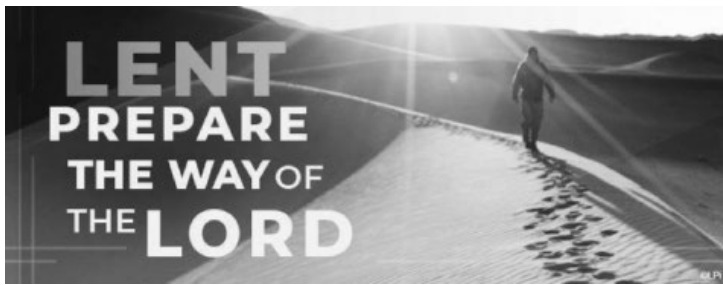

DID YOU KNOW?

- Jesus Christ is the symbolic interpretation of the partridge in the carol "The Twelve Days of Christmas." The partridge will pretend to be injured in order to draw predators to itself and away from its young. The pear tree is the Cross itself.
- There are three theological virtues: faith hope & charity. Theological virtues are those virtues infused by God and related to salvation, where God is the goal. Faith is defined as the virtue of believing the things revealed by God to be true, under His guidance and inspiration. Hope is also a divinely infused virtue by which, which confidence, we expect the divine assistance, eternal happiness and the means to attain it. WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Tithing vs. Stewardship

Question:

What is the difference between *tithing* and *stewardship*?

Answer:

Both tithing and stewardship are part of a spiritual way of life that calls us to use all of our resources for the service of the Gospel. All we are and everything we have comes from God. Offering back to God what He has given us is part of how we worship and give thanks to God.

Tithing is the practice of giving back 10 percent of what we earn. It comes from the Old English word for "ten." The first Scriptural example of tithing came from Abraham who gave a tenth of his possessions to Melchizedek, the priest. He did so as an act of thanksgiving to God.

Stewardship as a way of life calls us to use well all that we have and all that we are, placing all things in service of others and God. Stewardship helps us see the good we can accomplish by making God and our spiritual life the most important values in our life.
