





ENCOUNTER

1st HOLY COMMUNION/MAY CROWNING

Over the past weekend and this weekend St. Joseph's and SS. Peter and Paul parishes celebrate 1st Holy Communion (May 1st and 8th, respectively) and they will also celebrate Blessed Mother, Mary, with a May Crowning (SS. Peter & Paul May 1st and St. Joseph May 8^{th)}.

A child's "First Communion" is a rite of passage, an acknowledgement that he or she has reached the age of reason and is now liable for many of the penalties involved in sin; it is, in other words, a marker that the child is growing up. It may be given to a group of children who've been properly prepared together. In addition, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is received first before Communion. In April 2012 Pope Benedict XVI told First Communicants in Rome that they would mark "the moment when you too understand the importance of a personal encounter with Jesus." Christ promised the Church his continued presence in "the Word and the Eucharist," the Pope said.

Pope Benedict explained that these "very realistic signs" helped the disciples "open up to the gift of faith" – which in turn helped them "understand the things written on Christ "in the law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms." The Pope reserved his final words for the children in St Peter's Square, before leading the recitation of the midday Marian Prayer.

"Mary, the Mother of God help us to listen attentively to the Word of the Lord and participate worthily in the Eucharistic Sacrifice, to become witnesses of the new humanity," he declared. These words help us today to connect First Holy Communion with the May crowning we celebrate these weekends.

The Catholic Church has, as a part of its tradition, the special devotion to the Blessed Mother of Jesus. Mary is recognized as "one of us," a human person, and a model of faith and discipleship for all Christians to imitate. When Jesus, from the cross, entrusted the Apostle, St. John, with the care of His mother, Catholics believe that Mary became our mother as well. Catholics do not worship Mary or consider her to be a goddess. Catholics recognize that mothers can have great influence over their children, and as such, we pray to Mary to intercede with her Son on our behalf. During the month of May it is a tradition in the church to honor Mary, our mother, in a special way, by placing crowns of spring blossoms on the head of a statue that depicts her image. This is a beautiful ceremony wherein the participants give thanks to Mary for bringing Jesus into the world, and pray for her guidance along the path that will lead to her Son.

Our children who received the Body and Blood of Christ will be the ones crowning the Blessed Mother. This will remind them that while they received Jesus and can continue to receive Him, the Blessed Mother is always at their side and is interceding for them.

"Holy Jesus and Blessed Mother Mary, continue to watch over those who receive their First Holy Communion and let them love you both more dearly."



THE REMNANT GENERATION

Annabelle Nakabiri Ssebakijje and her husband Isaac Mukisa Ssebakijje will be here at Sts. Peter and Paul on Saturday, June 4^{th} and Sunday June 5^{th} .

Annabelle is the founder and executive director of the Remnant Generation in Kampala, Uganda. It is similar to our pregnancy centers in that it provides spiritual, mental and emotional healing and therapy for survivors of sexual abuse and teen moms. In Uganda a young girl that becomes pregnant is often put out of the home. It is Christ-centered and Pro-Life. The princess shelter can hold up to 20 girls and 20 babies at one time. While there, the young girls can learn a trade for when they leave the shelter. COVID hurt them with their fundraising and they will be requesting help while they are here. They will speak Saturday after Mass in St Francis Hall at 6:30pm and Sunday after mass at 12:30 in the gathering space in the church. Please come out and hear the stories and the talk that Annabelle will be giving and learn about life in Uganda. I visited the Remnant Generation with Father Gerald while I was in Uganda in 2019 and can attest that they are legitimate.

RELUCTANT SHEEP

Sheep get an awfully bad rap, linguistically. Some are quick to label people as "sheep" if we think they haven't sufficiently questioned authority or if they're too willing to go along with someone else's plan. We say someone has "the wool over their eyes" if they aren't willing to see what we think is very obvious. "A wolf in sheep's clothing" is what we call someone looking to take advantage of those too gullible to identify a real threat. Taking all this into account and considering how often we are referred to as sheep in Scripture, you've really got to wonder if God trying to tell us something about ourselves.

If you look at the phraseology associated with sheep, it's no wonder that nobody wants to be one. Sheep are innocent. Sheep can't protect themselves. They're vulnerable and easily misled. We want to see ourselves as the opposite of all that. We like to think we're shrewd, with plenty of common sense. We want to believe that we don't have to rely on anybody for anything. We would sooner identify with the wolf than with the sheep — at least the wolf can take care of himself. We do this because we often resist the need to rest in the greatness of God. Like a child walking to school alone for the first time (forgetting his mom is following watchfully in the car), we want to think we can handle it all by ourselves.

The truth is that God is trying to tell us something by comparing us to sheep: You don't have to do this on your own. Every time I look at an obstacle and think that there is no way around it, I am forgetting that I have a shepherd who knows the location of the gate.



Christ is our hope

I was filled with a lot of joy last Sunday as I witnessed the beauty of our little shrine – St. Joseph: Ariel was baptized and two of his siblings: Amanda and Antonio presented to the Lord in a very colorful ceremony. Yet still, it was all joy to witness Gianna and Lily receive their First Communion. For those who know me well, they can testify that kids bring the best out me. Like most of you, this day filled me with joy, but also made me think more about the future of our little and beautiful shrine - St. Joseph.

The city of Columbia may be no more, but yet the presence of St. Joseph church every Sunday and Thursday still gives hope to this historic city: **Indeed Christ is our hope**, and this is what we teach our children as we celebrate sacraments with them. Yes, we teach them, but they challenge us to think about what we teach them.

As we think about the future of our little shrine, we realize that there are several repairs and maintenance works that are long overdue, and we must embark on them as soon as possible. At the beginning of Lent, I asked you to save some change to help us with project of repair and maintenance. At the end of this exercise, we ended up with \$ 362.50, and I thank you very much. GOSPEL MEDITATION

We are taught, by listening to the voices around us, that truth is found in feelings and thought, and ideals must match current and popular human wants. Because we feel a particular way it must be true. Then, we find a shepherd who empathizes with us and affirms us. We follow that voice even though listening to that voice will render us without power and lead us to harm. There are many with me in this procession to this pasture. I must be on the right path and listening to the right voice.

We are very confused. What can keep us safe and from harm? Where do we go to find life, love, and happiness? Jesus tells us that he is the way, the truth and the life.
