


Sts. Peter and Paul finished Fiscal year 2022 with a favorable net budget. Budgeted revenue was \$475,450, actual revenue was \$497,011, or 4% above budgeted revenue. The weekly Offertory Collection was budgeted at 330,000, actual collection was \$311,069, or a 5.7% below budgeted collections. Fundraising was budgeted at \$16,500 (net of spending) and finished the year at \$24,853 (net of spending), or a 51% increase. Debt reduction was budgeted at \$70,000 and finished with \$76,198, or an 8% increase in debt reduction collections. Finally, the Richmond Diocese provided Sts. Peter and Paul with a grant of \$25,000 to go toward debt reduction. This will significantly accelerate our plan to retire our diocesan debt before 2026.

On the spending side, budgeted costs for FY2023 were \$390,450, actual spending finished at \$369,871, or a 5.5% decrease in actual spending. Net revenue was budgeted at \$85,000; actual net revenue for FY2023 was \$127,140.

On behalf of the Finance Council thank you for your stewardship. We realize the sacrifice you make to support Sts Peter and Paul. Fiscal year 2022 financial results demonstrate that your contributions are administered carefully. Please continue to support Sts Peter and Paul through our current fiscal year so that we can fulfill our mission to evangelize, sanctify, and serve.



### **EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS** The Zeal of the Convert by — Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS

When you work in the Church, professionally or on a volunteer basis, you become familiar with the phenomenon known as "the zeal of the recent convert." Sometimes, it really seems that the newly baptized are just stronger Catholics than the cradle Catholics. They smile more at Mass. They are awestruck by the Eucharist. They come out of the confessional beaming.

It's not that they are naive. It's not that they are in some honeymoon phase of religion, living outside of reality. It's simply that they remember. They remember what it felt like before the Eucharist or before Confession. They recall before the sacraments and the oil and the grace and the relief. It was more recent for them than for some of us older Catholics especially those of us who were baptized as infants.

Let's ask ourselves: Have we become too comfortable? Do we receive God's grace with expectation instead of surprise? Have we ceased to marvel and wonder at the goodness of God? If the answer is a resounding yes, don't despair. Look at the Gospel — a literal nine times out of ten, God goes un-thanked and un-noticed.

So many of us have forgotten, or never understood, what it meant when the leprosy was washed from our souls. But when we remind ourselves, we become more keenly aware of the extraordinariness of the gift we have received.







- Pope Adrian IV (Pontificate from 1154-1159) is the only English pope, born Nicholas Breakspear,
- The four servant songs of Isaiah (42:1-4, 49:1-6, 50:4-9 and 52:13-53:12) are strategically placed in Second Isaiah to offer hope and consolation to a suffering Israel during its Babylonian Exile. Each of the four poems emphasizes God's choice and election of the servant. The last poem stresses the suffering and rejection of God's servant, along with his eventual death. Isaiah is certain that God will use the servant's innocent suffering as a way to redeem and remove the guilt and sin of others. Thus, the servant becomes a source of salvation for himself and for others. Who is this servant? Many suggest that Isaiah was referring to Israel herself as she underwent exilic suffering which would ultimately prove to be redemptive.
