



- -Providing homes for orphaned children



The part-time Director of Music (DM) is responsible for planning and facilitating music at parish liturgical celebrations. This includes, but is not limited to weekend liturgies, funerals, weddings, Feast Days and prayer services. The DM works closely with the Parish Staff, especially the Pastor, in coordinating music for these celebrations, and provides training for musicians (i.e. Cantors and Pianists) in and outside of the parish.

Ability to express ideas clearly both in written and oral communication. Project a friendly spiritual atmosphere to parishioners. Organize tasks to facilitate their timely accomplishment.



- If a consecrated host accidentally falls on the ground, a priest, deacon, or Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion will pick it up immediately and consume it?
- If the Precious Blood is spilled, the minister will use a purificator to clean up the spill and then the area will be reverently washed as soon as the Mass is over and the water poured into the sacrarium (a special sink in the sacristy) for reverently disposing of holy water, water used to clean sacred vessels, etc.




