





ENCOUNTER

Summer with the Saints

Saint John Vianney

(May 8, 1786 - August 4, 1859)

The story of humanity consists in God calling his people back to him after we have turned away from him. The prophets and priests of ancient Israel were sent to exhort God's chosen people to be faithful to their covenant with God, and St. John the Baptist was the forerunner to Christ in preaching repentance. None of us today are perfect or sinless, but God still calls us back to himself and offers us forgiveness in the Sacrament of Confession. No saint understood the Sacrament of Confession better than Saint John Vianney.

John Vianney was a child in France during the tumultuous time of the French Revolution, when priests and religious sisters were forced into exile or executed. As a child, John Vianney witnessed the heroic sacrifices of priests risking their lives to celebrate mass and provide the sacraments to his family.

After his ordination, John Vianney was assigned to become the parish priest in Ars, France, where the parishioners suffered from religious ignorance and indifference. John dedicated his priestly ministry to Eucharistic Adoration and Sacramental Confession. John Vianney would be in his confessional for 12 hours a day and took on voluntary penances to pray for his penitents. People would flock from across France and beyond and wait for hours to go to confession with John Vianney, who was given the grace to read souls. John Vianney became such a renowned confessor and instrument of God's mercy because he first had encountered God's mercy and love.

The Sacraments of Confession and Holy Communion are not only essential parts of our Catholic faith, but they are essential for our vocations to holiness and heroic virtue. Saint John Vianney's dedication to these two sacraments is why he is the Patron Saint of Priests, because it is through priests that we receive forgiveness of our sins and that ordinary bread and wine is turned into the Body and Blood of Jesus.

Financial Review:

June 30 marked the end of the fiscal year for Sts. Peter and Paul. I am pleased to announce that Sts. Peter and Paul finished the fiscal year on budget. Income was within 1% of budgeted amounts, while spending was significantly lower than budgeted amounts.

On the income side, the offertory collection was 7% above budgeted amounts. All three categories of the offertory collection finished above budgeted amounts: envelopes, loose collections, and E-giving. Fundraising was 6% above budgeted amounts despite the cancellation of the annual golf tournament. However, debt collection was under the budgeted amounts by 26%. Consequently, our payments to the diocese were decreased to offset the shortfall.

On the spending side, nearly every budget category finished the year below budgeted amounts. A significant portion of the savings was due to the open position in Faith Formation. Operations was 7% below budget, and facilities was 27% under budget. The facilities budget savings is mainly due to timing of expenses. Because the repairs to fix the water damage in the Adoration Chapel could not be completed in FY2024, the spending was moved to FY2025. It is our biggest priority with regard to facilities this fiscal year.

Your response to our budget shortfall early last year was amazing. We made up the entire budget deficit and met all of our budgeted obligations. Thank you for your continuing support of Sts. Peter and Paul.

OUESTION: Catholic Q & A

If God knows everything we do, why do we need to go to Confession?

ANSWER:

Another term for the Sacrament of Confession is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We go to this sacrament not only to confess our sins, but to be reconciled with God. Of course, this begs the question, "If I can pray to God on my own, why can't I be reconciled to God on my own?" In the seven sacraments, we recognize the importance of community. Sacraments like baptism or matrimony happen in the context of the wider church to remind us of the communal impact of our lives. We are not alone in our walk of faith!

We don't need to confess our sins in front of the whole community – thank God! But going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a tangible reminder that our sins affect not only ourselves and our relationship with God, but others as well. Jesus gave his Apostles authority to forgive sins in his name. Through this sacrament, we are really, truly forgiven by God Himself. We receive an outpouring of grace and strength to sin no more and our relationship with Christ and his Body, the Church, are restored.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

August 4, 2024 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Since my college days I've loved a song called "Dance with You" by the rock band Live. It touches on the deep mystical hunger of our heart: "I've tasted all the wines/ a half a billion times/ came sickened to your shore/ you showed me what this life is for." These lines resonate with anyone who has feasted on the good things of this world only to be left spiritually hungover and unsatisfied.

We see a similar dynamic evoked by Jesus' words after he feeds the crowd with bread and fish. To teach them to hunger for God, he recalls God's gift of manna-bread for the hungry ancient Israelites. Those folks had grown spiritually sick from the idolatrous food of Egypt yet still longed for more worthless pagan



food. So, God sent heavenly bread to nourish their bodies, but also to heal their distrustful hearts. His people — like us — must learn to hunger and thirst for God alone. Before we can receive that which will not disappoint, we first must cease expecting that earthly goods will satisfy us.

We will get to the Lord's teaching on the Eucharist in the next two weeks. But first, he asks us: do you trust me to take care of you? Do you trust me to give you what you need for each day, and to not worry about the next day? Do you see that when you

hungrily stuff yourself with the things of this world you become sick and lose your taste for the bread of life? So, our hungry hearts cry out: Lord, help us to trust that you'll provide for our every need. Help us to use only what we truly need. Help us hunger for the goodness of your Son, who is the true bread from heaven. That is what this life is for. — Father John Muir



FOOD THAT PERISHES

It's so easy to do the right thing because we want to tick all the right boxes. We want to live by the law. We want to accomplish the work of God.

Or, at least, we say that we do.

But Jesus tells us that in order to accomplish the work of God, we have to believe in the one he sent. And to believe in Christ is to be filled with the spirit of truth — to do what is right because it is right, not because we want to be filled with good feelings.

What is the difference between doing what is right because you want to be a good Christian, and doing what is right because you believe in Christ?



It's the difference between eating manna and the Eucharist. One fills your stomach and keeps you alive, and nothing more. The other satisfies a hunger you might not have even known you had, or if you did know, you called it by another name — sadness, unfulfillment, fear. One achieves a corporeal goal, and that's the end of it. The other accomplishes something invisibly, secretly, silently, and though there is physical evidence of its work all around us, you have to be shrewd to recognize it.

It's the difference between making a social media post condemning sin and enveloping a sinner (the one at our dinner table, the one on the street, the one staring back at us in the mirror) with love and concern. It's the difference between simply going to Mass and living the Gospel. It's the difference between speaking to God and saying a prayer. It's the difference between telling someone they're wrong and telling them about the truth.

There's nothing wrong doing what is right because we long for heaven, and there's nothing wrong with eating manna if you're starving. But that alone isn't enough. We must also long for the bread of heaven, the bread that gives life to the world.
