



Adoration Chapel repairs - I am looking for \$ 25,000

Dear Sts. Peter and Paul parishioners and friends,

This summer has proven to be costly by way of repair and maintenance at our beautiful church. Our septic system had not been emptied for a very long time. We had to tend to it at a cost of \$6400. Thanks to the success of our Yard Sale this was paid for out of the general fund.

If you recall, our cash reserve fund was established five years ago for the purpose of addressing emergencies, when they arise. Due to your quarterly donations to this fund, we have some money available to pay for half of our needed repairs. I thank you heartily for your continued generosity towards our cash reserve.

Will you now help me to raise \$25,000 for the ongoing great work that is being done to our church,

and soon to be completed? Yes, this had to be done immediately to ensure that we get back to worship in a safe and healthy space. Our Adoration Chapel and all the rooms on that side of the church were in a sorry state whenever it rained; water was finding its way through the foundation making those rooms unsafe to use. Something had to be done, and we did it, and it is soon to be completed, but with a sizable cost to us:

Grading and Drainage at a cost of \$ 23,500

Gutters, Downspouts, sidewalk repair at a cost of \$ 15,500

Stucco, carpet and electricity at a cost of \$ 10,500

You may be aware that in the year 2026, we shall be marking our 40th anniversary. Our 40th Anniversary Committee has advised me that among other priorities towards that celebration, is renovating and repairing some of our infrastructure. The need to repair the foundation of our church has escalated itself to priority one, and we have timely responded.

I would like to ask you to do your best, like you have always done, and check this item off our list of the things to be done as we move towards our celebration in 2026.

I sincerely thank you for your consideration as I keep you in my prayers.

THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Thursday's feast celebrates Mary's Assumption into heaven. It is one of three feasts of Mary that are Holy Days of Obligation for Catholics in the United States. January 1 is the feast of Mary, the Mother of God, and December 8 is the feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary. The assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven has long been held as an important Catholic belief. The belief was not defined as dogma, however, until 1950 by Pope Pius XII. The dogma teaches that Mary, who was without sin, was taken, body and soul, into the glory of heaven.

The Gospel for this holy day recalls Mary's actions after the announcement of Jesus' birth by the Angel Gabriel. Mary goes to visit her cousin Elizabeth who is also with child. Elizabeth greets Mary with full recognition of the roles they and their unborn children will play in God's plan for salvation. Mary responds to Elizabeth's greeting with her song of praise, the Magnificat. Both women recall and echo God's history of showing favor upon the people of Israel. Mary's Magnificat, in particular, echoes the song of praise offered by Hannah, the mother of Samuel.

The Gospel for this day reminds us that Mary's Assumption into heaven is best understood with regard for the full spectrum of Catholic beliefs about the person of Christ and the person of Mary. Only Mary, who was born without stain of original sin the Immaculate Conception—could give birth to Christ, who is fully God and fully human. This is called the Immaculate Conception. Because of Mary's role in God's plan of salvation, she does not suffer from the effects of sin, which are death and decay. Mary is the first to receive the fullness of the redemption that her son has won for all of humanity. The Church, therefore, recognizes Mary as the sign of the salvation promised to all.

The Gospel highlights Mary's faith. Mary's faith enabled her to recognize the work of God in her people's history and in her own life. Her openness to God allowed God to work through her so that salvation might come to all. Mary is a model and symbol of the Church. May we be like Mary, open and cooperative in God's plan of salvation.

Catholic Q & A

QUESTION:

I've heard that faith is a theological virtue. What does that mean?

ANSWER:

To say a virtue is theological means that it comes as a gift from God. St. Thomas Aquinas, a Dominican monk who crafted the famous arguments for the existence of God, wrote: *"This alone is the true knowledge of God: to know that God is beyond knowing."* God is transcendent. This word comes from the Latin "transcendere," meaning "to climb beyond." When something is transcendent, it exists beyond our normal range of experience. Philosopher Peter Kreeft put it simply: *"God is always more."*

While God created us in His image and likeness, too often we re-create Him in ours. We project our deepest hopes, our subliminal fears, and our hidden dreams, and conjure up our own image of what God could be. Yet God can never be limited to our own perception of Him.

That's where faith comes in. We read in the Catechism that *"faith is the theological virtue by which we believe in God and believe all that He has said and revealed to us and all that the Holy Church proposes for our belief"* (CCC 1814). We can know God through reason, to a point. As human beings, we want to know and understand the world around us, but God isn't in the world around us. He's beyond it. The best way to come to know God is not through our own clever mental maneuvering, but through trusting in God's revelation of Himself. We might think we know who God is, but the only way we can have any idea is if we trust, through the virtue of faith, who He has revealed Himself to be.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

August 11, 2024 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

This week we hear Jesus say, "He that believes in me, has eternal life" (John 6:47). These straightforward words, uttered by human lips, sound — how to put this? — insane. Who could possibly say such a thing? Jesus says things that are so high, so demanding, so beyond our capacity to fathom, we hardly know what to do with them and (if you're like me), they usually go in one ear and out the other. So, let us ask: how can believing in him lead to eternal life?



To believe in something means not just to acknowledge its existence, but also to orient yourself entirely to it. If a football player believes in his team, it means he puts his life totally at the service of that goal. If a student believes in her dream to become a doctor, she gives everything she has to her studies and preparation for her MCAT test. Belief means to move boldly toward something we love, and trust is

possible to attain.

What is the highest possible good at which we can aim? It is God himself, the gift of eternal life without end. Jesus has made this "good" possible in and through his human nature. To believe in him means to have him as our ultimate goal. This week let's believe the truth of these words and make practical decisions to orient ourselves toward what we see available in him: **eternal life**.
